The Miracles of Jesus - (A Selected Article)

Miracle: It may suffice here to define miracle as any deviation from or transcendence of the order of nature, due to the interposition of a supernatural cause." (James Orr, The Faith of a Modern Christian, page 65) It is more than something amazing, or something hard to explain. A miracle is more than simply something that is attributed to God. It is something beyond the realm of natural possibility and involves the setting aside of the laws of nature.

Biblical miracles are drastically different from the pseudomiracles you see on TV. Jesus nor the apostles never requested or demanded money. Their miracles were not easily explained away as having been a trick or sleight of hand. Even enemies could not deny the reality. They were never for self-glory. They suffered no failures. There was never the beginning of a miracle or a slow developing miracle.

Purpose of Miracles:

Why did Jesus perform miracles? John sums up the purpose for miracles is John 20:30-31: Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the *Son of God*, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

When John the baptizer asked if this One was the Christ, Jesus sent word back of the miracles he had performed. Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what

you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. And blessed is the one who is not offended by me." (Matthew 11:2-5)

By the power of miracles Jesus declared to be the Son of God (Acts 2:22). We can have confidence in the identity of Jesus – He did what no ordinary man could have done. He did for us what no man could have done – make salvation from sins possible.
