The Life Most Blessed (Mark 10.17-31)

- I. Introduction. (Mark 10.17)
 - A. An <u>important</u> question.
 - B. A <u>humble</u> question:
 - 1. "<u>Good</u><u>Teacher</u>"
 - 2. "What shall I do to <u>inherit</u> eternal life?"
- II. "And Jesus said to him ... "
 - A. "<u>Keep</u> the <u>commandments</u>" (Matthew 19.17)
 - 1. Jesus saw no conflict between <u>inheritance</u> (gift) and <u>obedience</u>
 - 2. Inheritance demands showing the proper honor and respect for the One who offers it.
 - B. "One thing you lack: go and <u>*sell*</u>" (Mark 10.21)
 - 1. Real discipleship requires <u>Sacrifice</u>.
 - "Lay aside every <u>encumbrance/weight</u> and the sin which so easily entangles us" (Hebrews 12.1)
 - C. "With <u>people</u> it is impossible, but not with <u>God</u>; for all things are possible with <u>God</u>." (Mark 10.27)
 - 1. Even with obedience and sacrifice, eternal life is an <u>inheritance</u>.
 - 2. In a word, <u>grace</u>.
 - D. It is the life <u>most</u> <u>blessed</u> (Mark 10.29-30)
 - 1. "Now in the <u>present</u> <u>age</u>"
 - 2. "And in the age to come, <u>eternal</u> <u>life</u>."
 - E. "But many who are <u>first</u> will be <u>last</u>, and the <u>last</u>, <u>first</u>." (Mark 10.31)
 - 1. The life most blessed is not for those who trust in themselves or do nothing at all...
 - 2. But for those who will truly say, "Not <u>my</u> will, but <u>Yours</u> be done." (Luke 22.42)
